Claudia Burson of Fayetteville Arkansas was introduced to jazz at a young age. Her uncle Kermit Burson was a professional guitarist and he took responsibility for her musical education by enrolling her for piano lessons early on. Upon completion of high school, Claudia was awarded a music scholarship to study classical music with

## **Doug Stiles**

(Nov.27, 1921 - Jun. 23,2002)



Doug Stiles, well-known Arkansas jazz man and remarkable jazz historian, died on Sunday June 23, 2002. He was born on Nov 27,1921, in Warren, Arkansas.

He made great contributions to jazz in Arkansas. He was an past president and key player in the Jazz Club of Arkansas. He was inducted into the Arkansas Jazz Hall of Fame and received the Arkansas Jazz Heritage Foundation's Arthur Porter Lifetime Achievement Award in December 2000, based on his many accomplishments. Most outstanding was that he had dedicated his entire life to absorbing as much musical knowledge and history as one individual possibly could.

But to persuade Stiles to discuss accomplishments and milestones throughout his career is not unlike pulling teeth; he'd much rather offer visitors a tour of his home's vast musical library while spinning records from his collection, which easily numbers in the thousands. Or he'll waste no time whatsoever describing the characteristics and elements found in the various genres of popular music. He may

Beatriz J. Pilapil at the University of Arkansas. Claudia followed her heart to Berklee College of Music in Boston in 1976.

In 1978, Ms. Burson moved to Houston, Texas where she performed with such notable artists as Arnett Cobb, Don Wilkerson, Eddie "Cleanhead" Vinson, Charlie Rouse, and Joe Henderson. Claudia is featured in the publication, Jazz Women Atthe Keyboard, written by Mary Unterbrink.

In 1998 Claudia returned to Fayetteville and has been performing regularly in concert halls, clubs, and private functions. She has quickly established herself as the preeminent pianist in the region, and is heard throughout the summer as part of the house rhythm section for the North Arkansas Jazz Societies Summer Jazz Concert Series. Along with her performance schedule, Claudia is teaching jazz piano and jazz ensemble at the University of Arkansas in Fayetteville.

Allan Gibson was born in Fayetteville, Arkansas, and began playing jazz in the seventh grade. After four years as a Navy musician, Allan worked free-lance in New Orleans, Houston, and in Austin. He performed with Beto ye los Fairlanes and his own dixieland band, the Dixie Scat Cats. In Fayetteville, Allan received his Master of Music in Jazz Composition from the UofA, is a member of the Claudia Burson Quartet, plays salsa with the Barrio Band, and has recently played for the Temptations, and the Duke Ellington show at the Walton Arts Center.

According to Robert Ginsberg, president of the North Arkansas Jazz Society, Allan is NW Arkansas' best kept jazz secret: "It's not unusual to find Al Gibson playing music by Dolphy, Coltrane, Ornette and Mingus..one night, and the next night laying down the tunes of Armstrong and Beiderbecke.... He has a clear round sound and a distinctive soloing conception-with chops to spare!" (Becca Bacon Martin, in Midwest Jazz, Summer 1997).

In addition to his jazz pursuits, Allan is music teacher at Butterfield Trail Elementary school, where he teaches, leads the blues band and the recorder ensemble and helps his children compose music.
