Continued from Page 1 - Monday Jazz sity of Arkansas and as a graduate of the UALR jazz studies program, he currently teaches woodwinds at Rosen Music and very much enjoys collaboration with other musicians, including Dave Rogers and Joe Vick.

Pianist Tom Cox is next on Monday June 11, 2007, 8 p.m., \$5 cover. The trio members include Joe Vick on bass and Dave Rogers on drums. Cox is an Arkansas native and jazz pianists/composer/bandleader, grew-up in Little Rock during the 50's and 60's. He did his undergraduate music studies at Indiana University and graduate studies at The Cleveland Institute of Music where he received degrees in music composition.

During the 70's he joined the faculties of the Cleveland Music School Settlement and Akron University's Firestone Conservatory of Music teaching theory, composition, jazz piano and improvisation. During that time he was also the leader of his own jazz quartet; some of its member included such recording artists as saxophonists Joe Lovano and Ernie Krivda, Marty Barker (drummer with Yusef Lateef), and Weather Report percussionist Skip Hadden. It was during this period that he also met and took brief piano-chair stints with international jazz artists Freddie Hubbard and Cannonball Adderly.

Cox returned to Little Rock in 1980 joining the music department faculty at UALR where he presently teaches jazz piano, jazz combo and directs the music theory program. Since returning to Arkansas he has had several different trios and quartets all of which have performed extensively throughout the state. He remains active as a jazz trio leader and composer.

The Happy Tymes Jazz Band featuring Billy Hunt (trumpet) on Monday

June 18, 2007, 8 p.m., \$10 cover. Billy Hunt, new trumpet player with the Happy Tymes Jazz Band, has a rather strong resume. He has played with the following: Les and Larry Elgart, Woody Herman, Billy May, Tommy Dorsey Orchestra / Warren Covington, Earl Green / Dunes at Las Vegas, Tommy Moses/MGM, Lou Elias/Vegas, Buddy Morrow, Maynard Ferguson, Al Beletto Sextet, and many others. Billy now resides in Grove, Oklahoma.

Bassist, vocalist, pianist, Tim Goodwin from Memphis with Les Pack, guitar and Dave Rogers, drums, performing on Monday July 16, 8 p.m., \$10 cover. Tim Goodwin, Associate Professor of Jazz and Studio Music Advisor (B.M., M.M.-Univ. of Miami), is very active in the recording industry and performs across the United States as a bassist. He has performed with numerous jazz artists including Lee Konitz, George Colemen, Pepper Adams, Art Farmer, Michele LeGrand, Jon Hendricks, Phineas Newborn, Mose Allison, as well as many others.

Mr. Goodwin was bassist of Thrio GRT which was selected to participate in the Kennedy Center "Jazz Ambassadors" program to present jazz performances and lectures around the world. As well as coordinating the jazz vocal activities at The University of Memphis, Mr. Goodwin conducts the Grammy in the

Schools All-Star Jazz Choir. He has served as an adjunct faculty member at the University of Miami and Miami-Dade Community College and joined The University of Memphis as a faculty member in 1984. Tim Goodwin received the Premier Bassist Award from the NARAS Memphis Chapter in 1992 and 2002.

jazz guitar sound and continues to redefine the genre. He is versatile both as a musician and composer, in styles ranging from modern jazz to rock to classical. Drummer Antonio Sanchez and bass player Christian McBride complete the Pat Metheny Trio line-up. Sanchez has been part of the Pat Metheny Group since 2002 and is among the most respected and in-demand drummers on the scene today, while McBride has arguably become the jazz world's most acclaimed acoustic and electric bassist.
