Two international acts - In Two Months! Our hats are off to Cece Rich, James Thomson and any others who are responsible for getting **Mose Allison** and **Art Lande** to Little Rock in back to back months. And there's more - those are only the biggest names.


They have also booked **Gene Rush**, **Vicho Vincencio** and many other great gigs. While this schedule is behind when we had planned to have it out, you can understand how difficult it was to get everything coordinated.

Mose Allison is returning to Little Rock on Nov. 8, and this time for \$15 you get to stay as late as you want! That's right - the whole evening and not just one show. You better not tarry since we are inevitably sold out when this jazz giant shows up. In fact, last time we almost had one divorce because the couple was late and they couldn't get tickets. Go by Capital Keyboards and pick up your tickets right away. While we have landed Mose Allison prior to this, it bears repeating that he is not just a jazz legend, but a musical genius that has inspired many very successful musicians, including Georgie Fame, John Mayall, Van Morrison, Randy Newman, Pete Townsend and Ben Sidran. Evidence was 1996's Tell Me Something (Verve Productions) featuring 13 Mose Allison compositions performed ART LANDE

Art Lande, the critically acclaimed pianist, composer, drummer and teacher, will return to Little Rock in December. He will play at the Unitarian Church Sunday Dec.5, at 7 pm, and at the AfterThought on Monday Dec. 6, at 8 pm.

Art is gifted and special in many ways, an artist truly not to be missed. He is a classically trained pianist, thoroughly athome with improvisational music, including the jazz tradition but not limited to that. He is a truly versatile artist, who writes poetry and paints, and has done interactive concerts with dance companies. He made a record of *The Adventures of Beatrix Potter* with Merryl Streep narrating, among many other farflung projects.

Art has been nominated for a Grammy, and was nominated for best Jazz musician in both Denver and San Francisco. He has received a neodata grant. He appears in many of the "Who's Who in Jazz" encyclopedias available today for his role in the development of Chamber Jazz.

by Morrison, Fame and Sidran, with Mose himself joining Morrison ("Brown Eyed Girl") on two selections. His latest CD is titled Gimcracks and Gewgaws (Blue Note Records). As if that weren't enough,

Grammy nominated Art Lande is coming on Dec. 6. While he is here he will also perform a piano concert at the Unitarian Universalist Church in Little Rock, 7PM. I was surprised to find out that he was one of the hands in Rabbit Ears Productions, a show I enjoyed Saturday mornings on NPR. He collaborated with Meryl Streep, Holly Hunter and Meg Ryan by composing and playing the music for fairy tales, which the ladies narrated.

Lande has a long and illustrious history as a musician and a teacher, including a stint at the University of Arkansas. He has played with the greats, including Joe Henderson, Woody Shaw, Bobby Hutcherson, Steve Swallow and Charlie Haden. In addition to all the above, he worked with poet Allen Ginsburg and combined with dancers such as Tandy Beal, Nancy Smith Hall and Joan Skinner. Talk about the big leagues! And the hits just keep on coming. By now you have missed pianists Gene Rush, **Charles Thomas** and guitarist **Tonk** Edwards if you didn't come by the Afterthought. All three were great shows, but with so much to talk about in November and December alone we'll just mention that they graced our stage, and we hope to see them again soon. However, you still have time to see the **John Puckett Trio**, a legend in central Arkansas. Usually playing in the Hot Springs area, they bring their version of jazz to Little Rock to begin our November sets.

After Mose Allison we get the John Craig Trio, usually seen on Tuesday night at Juanita's. John Craig is widely known and celebrated for his Blues playing, but along with Mark on the bass (and vocals) he brings an energy to the freedom of jazz which is very exciting. And, as usual, James made sure he booked him on a night when I am scheduled to take tickets at the door.

Start Christmas week with a visit to see Blind Boy White and let us wish you a Merry Christmas in person.
